I would like to share the following quote by Maria Montessori:

It is the true that the child develops in his environment through activity itself, but he needs material means, guidance, and indispensable understanding. It is the adult who provides these necessities....If (the adult) does less than is necessary, the child cannot act meaningfully, and if he does more than is necessary, he imposes himself upon the child, extinguishing (the child's) creative impulses.

It is a fine line we walk observing our children and determining when they can work on their own and solve their own problems and when they need support. In the classroom we strive to offer only good choices. This allows children to choose their own work and to work at their own pace. The adults' role in the classroom is to get to know each child and observe him/her, providing support only when needed and a new lesson when the child is ready or needs something to spark his/her interest. Our goal is to help the child become an independent, self confident, intrinsically motivated and socially responsive.
